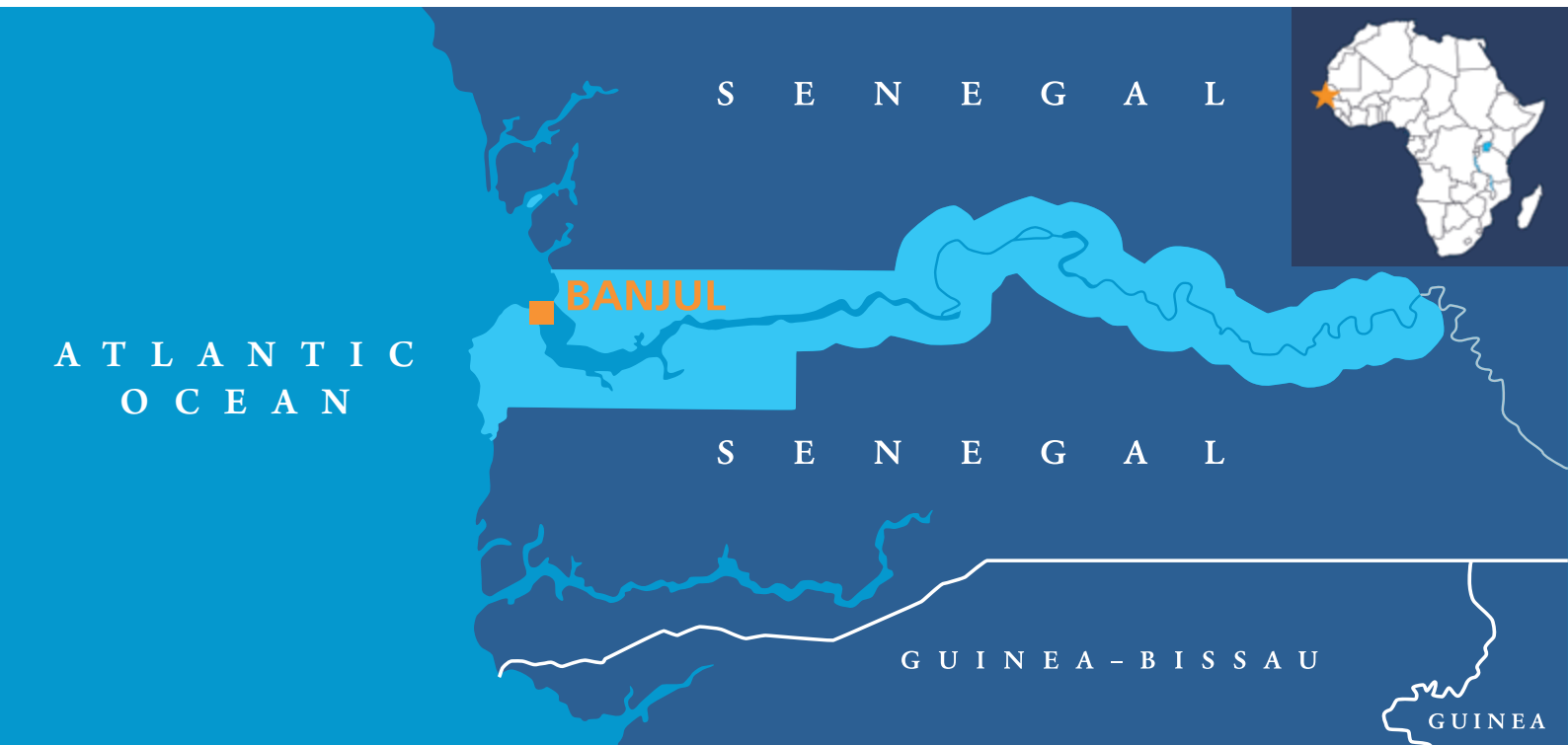
Headquarters



The International Open University (IOU) headquarters is located in the district of Kanifing South in the town of Kanifing, 13 kilometers west of the capital city of Banjul. It is located in the heart of Serrekunda, the largest urban center in The Gambia, and is visible to motorists who drive along the Banjul-Serrekunda highway. The landmark three-story building has an imposing appearance and can't be missed along the Iceman Junction.

IOU has made significant contributions to tertiary education in The Gambia, and is a notable institution that is unique as the only completely accredited online institution in the country. Through its Intensive English Course (IEC) initiative, it has assisted the Gambian government in providing Madrassah students access to conventional schools and other institutions. The headquarters houses the Vice Chancellor's office, supported by an administrative team, and an active student committee. It also has a scholarship learning center, library, and offers students free access to computers and wifi.

The Gambia



The Gambia is a beautiful, peaceful country, and is the smallest nation in the African continent. It is located in West Africa and is surrounded by Senegal, except for its western coast with the Atlantic Ocean. It gained its independence in 1965 from the United Kingdom, and has an area of 11,300 square kilometers. Its population is approximately 2 million with a Muslim majority, and its capital city of Banjul and its greater area are the country's largest metropolitan area.



The Gambia is renowned for its diverse landscapes, which include the Gambia River that flows through its center and empties into the Atlantic Ocean. Not only does the river provide a picturesque natural setting, but it also functions as a major transportation corridor and a source of income for many Gambians. The economy is heavily reliant on agriculture, which accounts for 25% of GDP and employs 75% of the labor force.

Academic Structure

The International Open University (IOU) offers certificate and degree programs in several disciplines. Its academic structure is as follows:



Faculty of Arabic and Islamic Studies

One of IOU's guiding principles is the teaching of authentic knowledge from the Quran and Sunnah. On the importance of learning Islam, the Messenger of Allah (pbuh) said, "Whoever takes a path upon which to obtain knowledge, Allah makes the path to Paradise easy for him" (Sunan Abu-Dawud). Actively pursuing studies for the attainment of *ilm* (knowledge) is a virtuous act which will enlighten the heart and fill it with understanding and purpose. For the Muslim, there is nothing that compares to reading the Quran with understanding and gaining insight into their religion, as knowledge increases *eemaan* (faith) and *taqwa* (God-consciousness).

Islamic Studies

The Prophet (pbuh) said, "Seeking knowledge is a duty upon every Muslim." Embark on the path of acquiring religious knowledge by equipping yourself with Islamic fundamentals including *Aqeedah* (Theology), *Fiqh* (Jurisprudence), *Seerah* (Prophetic Biography), *Tafseer* (Quranic Explanation), *Hadeeth* (Prophetic Narrations), Arabic language, and *Da'wah* (Propagation).

Bachelor of Arts in Islamic Studies (BAIS)

This four-year program was launched in 2010 and was the first degree offered by IOU. The curriculum is based on the baccalaureate program in *Usool ud-Deen* (Religious Foundations) of Madeenah University and other similar reputable Islamic institutions. It is available in English, Russian, and Bahasa Indonesia.

- **Entry Requirements:** An accredited secondary or high school certificate or diploma.
- **Completion Requirement:** 40 academic courses, including the thesis, and 216 hours of community service within 9 years.

Postgraduate Certificate in Islamic Studies (BMAIS)

This year-and-a-half program is a bridge to the Master's degree (MAIS) program that is offered to students who already possess an undergraduate degree or its equivalent in another discipline. It contains courses in *Aqeedah*, *Fiqh*, *Tafseer*, *Seerah* and *Hadeeth* from the Bachelor's degree (BAIS) program. It is available in English and Bahasa Indonesia.

- **Entry Requirements:** Graduate or postgraduate degree in any field other than Islamic Studies
- **Completion Requirement:** 17 academic courses within 4.5 years.

Master of Arts in Islamic Studies (MAIS)

This two-year program is a rigorous but rewarding program that provides an excellent opportunity for students interested in research training. It is a useful qualification for those who wish to progress to a doctorate and are aiming to achieve this highest level of scholarship in Islamic Studies. It is available in English and Bahasa Indonesia.

- **Entry Requirements (any one):**
 - » Bachelor's degree in Islamic Studies
 - » Bachelor's degree or higher in any discipline other than Islamic Studies along with IOU's Postgraduate Certificate (BMAIS)
 - » Bachelor's degree or higher in any discipline other than Islamic Studies, along with a minimum of 36 university-level credit hours of core Islamic Studies courses, as well as passing an admission and Arabic exemption tests.
- **Completion Requirement:** 16 academic courses, including the thesis, within 4 years.

Arabic Language



Attaining a basic understanding of the Quran, *hadeeth* (narrations), and daily prayers without the need for translation or interpretation is not possible without taking the first step - learning Arabic. There is a beauty to the language that reveals itself when you study it. Which is why Allah (swt) chose it to convey His Final Message to humankind. Allah said, "We have certainly made the Quran easy for remembrance ..." (Surah al-Qamar (54):17). However, true contemplation is not achieved by merely memorizing it, but understanding it. Begin learning Arabic today and open the doors and your heart to new spiritual insights and knowledge.

Intensive Arabic Program (IAP)

This two-year program consists of 8 classical Arabic program taught two per semester. Each year, the first semester focuses on reading, writing and listening, while the second semester covers basic conversational skills and grammar.

- **Entry Requirements:** Fluent in reading Quranic Arabic script or completion of an introductory Arabic course.
- **Completion Requirement:** 8 academic program and 72 hours of community service within 6 years.

Bachelor's Degree in Arabic Language Studies (BA ALS)


This four-year program was developed by more than 50 professors who teach non-Arabic speaking students. The program consists of courses similar to those taught at Imam Muhammad bin Saud University in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, as well as courses taught to non-native speakers in other Arabic universities.

- **Entry Requirements:** An accredited secondary or high school certificate or diploma.
- **Completion Requirement:** 43 academic courses, including a thesis in Arabic, and 216 hours of community service within 9 years.

Postgraduate Certificate in Arabic Language (BM ARB)

This one-year program is a bridge to the Master's degree (MA ARB) program that is offered to students who already possess an undergraduate degree or higher in another discipline and a good background in the Arabic language. It contains 10 advanced Arabic courses from the Bachelor's degree (BA ALS) program.

- **Entry Requirements:** Graduate or postgraduate degree in any field other than Arabic.
- **Completion Requirement:** 10 academic courses within 3 years.

 Credits from the Intensive Arabic Program can be transferred to the Bachelor of Arts in Islamic Studies (BAIS) program.

Education



The vocation of teaching is held in the highest esteem in the religion of Islam, as imparting knowledge is the duty and obligation of every practicing Muslim. The Prophet Muhammad (pbuh) was the greatest teacher and he encouraged us to share beneficial knowledge when he said, “Convey (my teachings) to the people, even if it were a single sentence” (Sahih al-Bukhari). Well-trained teachers will always be in demand and are indeed a necessity to the *Ummah* (nation). Students taking this course of study will enjoy a comprehensive curriculum that provides a range of academic, linguistic, and digital literacies.

Certificate in Education (C.Ed)

This one-year program introduces students to the basic principles in the field of education. The program nurtures the knowledge of teaching and pedagogical skills of students based on the new trend in Education for sustainable development.

- **Entry Requirements:** An accredited secondary or high school certificate or diploma.
- **Completion Requirement:** 10 academic courses within 3 years.

Associate Degree in Education (A.Ed)


This two-year program was designed to further develop and strengthen teaching skills in a student. It aims to give students the basic technical and academic knowledge and transferable skills for teaching and assessment in schools.

- **Entry Requirements:** An accredited secondary or high school certificate or diploma.
- **Completion Requirement:** 22 academic courses and 72 hours of community service within 6 years.

Bachelor's Degree in Education (B.Ed)

This four-year program has subject specialization streams of English and Islamic Studies and its curriculum is based on courses taught at The Open University, United Kingdom, and Nelson Mandela University, South Africa. The program has been carefully formulated and developed to respond to national and global education needs and trends.

- **Entry Requirements:** An accredited secondary or high school certificate or diploma.
- **Completion Requirement:** 42 academic courses, including a thesis, and 216 hours of community service within 9 years.

 Course credits in the certificate and associate degree programs can be later used towards the associate and bachelor's degrees.

Psychology



In today's social climate, it has become imperative to provide psycho-social support for Muslims. However, this support must be offered from a perspective that is compatible with religious principles. Islam teaches that the heart has an impact on the psyche and *nafs* (soul). Consequently, psychology taught from an Islamic perspective focuses on the Quranic view of controlling one's inward desires. As Allah (swt) stated, "And indeed We have created humankind and know what their *nafs* whispers to them ..." (Surah al-Qamar (50):16). Studying psychology from an Islamic point of view equips you to help others with diseases of the heart and soul.

Certificate in Psychology (C.Psy)

This one-year program was designed to provide students with basic knowledge in Islamic Psychology that teaches fundamental issues on the heart and soul for the benefit of their spiritual well-being. It contains a variety of courses including abnormal psychology, mental health, and child psychology.

- **Entry Requirements:** An accredited secondary or high school certificate or diploma.
- **Completion Requirement:** 12 academic courses within 3 years.

Associate Degree in Psychology (A.Psy)


This two-year program was designed to expose students to more in the field of Islamic psychology, including to understand the nature of the *nafs* (soul), *qalb* (heart), *fitrah* (natural state), *aql* (intellect), and *hawa* (animal self), and how they function within the human personality.

- **Entry Requirements:** An accredited secondary or high school certificate or diploma.
- **Completion Requirement:** 24 academic courses and 72 hours of community service within 6 years.

Bachelor of Science in Psychology (BSc Psy)

This four-year program was designed to give students a full exposure to understanding psychology from an Islamic perspective. It combines classical Islamic science with contemporary academic understanding of humans, their psyche, and their nature.

- **Entry Requirements:** An accredited secondary or high school certificate or diploma.
- **Completion Requirement:** 40 academic courses, including a thesis, and 216 hours of community service within 9 years.

 Course credits in the certificate and associate degree programs can be later used towards the associate and bachelor's degrees.

Economics



Economics has existed for centuries, and so has the study of this discipline. However, with the rise of industrialization, inflation, and other financial challenges, a superior alternative to the standard secular studies needs to be used. As a result, studying this field from an Islamic perspective has become increasingly relevant in modern society. It continues to increase in popularity as a significant area of study due to the crucial role of banking and finance. Financial transactions should be conducted in a *halal* (lawful) manner, as it is mentioned in verse 275 of Surah al-Baqarah, "Allah has permitted trade and forbidden interest."

Career Prospects

Certificate in Islamic Economics, Banking, and Finance (CIBE)

This one-year program gives students an understanding of basic concepts of economics and finance from an Islamic perspective. The courses taught highlight the important issues and challenges related to banking and finance.

- **Entry Requirements:** An accredited secondary or high school certificate or diploma.
- **Completion Requirement:** 12 academic courses within 3 years.

Associate Degree in Islamic Economics, Banking, and Finance (AIBE)


This two-year program gives students an understanding of basic and advanced concepts of economics and finance from an Islamic perspective. It highlights the important issues and challenges related to banking and finance, and gives an idea of Islamic solutions/alternatives to the same.

- **Entry Requirements:** An accredited secondary or high school certificate or diploma.
- **Completion Requirement:** 24 academic courses and 72 hours of community service within 6 years.

Bachelor's of Science in Islamic Economics, Banking, and Finance (BSc IEBF)

This four-year program is a blend of conventional economics and finance courses with Islamic courses, and includes all major focal areas of the field. The courses have selectively and strategically been included in the aim of providing students with thorough knowledge and skills in the financial sector.

- **Entry Requirements:** An accredited secondary or high school certificate or diploma.
- **Completion Requirement:** 37 academic courses, including a thesis, and 216 hours of community service within 9 years.

 Course credits in the certificate and associate degree programs can be later used towards the associate and bachelor's degrees.

Information Technology



Information Technology (I.T.) is the application of computers and telecommunication systems to store, retrieve, and send information. Companies are always looking for talented individuals who can create, maintain and support their information systems. Pursuing a program that uniquely combines I.T. with Islam creates an opportunity for students to fulfill their religious duty of seeking and sharing knowledge, while also acquiring sought-after skills in this field. Become a high-value asset to employers while receiving rewards. As the Prophet (pbuh) said, "The best of people are those who are most beneficial to people."

Certificate in Information Technology (CIT)

This one-year program introduces a student to the Information Technology discipline. The focus of the program is on some basic I.T. concepts including system and application software, problem solving skills, calculus and discrete mathematics, and some basic object oriented programming skills.

- **Completion Requirement:** 12 academic courses within 3 years.

Associate Degree in Information Technology (AIT)


This two-year program further develops a student's skills in the I.T. discipline. It covers several core themes including operating systems, computer networks, database management, software engineering, object oriented programming, data structures and algorithms.

- **Entry Requirements:** An accredited secondary or high school certificate or diploma.
- **Completion Requirement:** 24 academic courses and 72 hours of community service within 6 years.

Bachelor of Science in Information Technology (BSc IT)

This four-year program features many carefully designed courses on the core and several advanced themes in Information Technology. This includes database management, software engineering, network administration, object oriented programming, web development, mobile phone application development, cloud computing, cyber security, and artificial intelligence.

- **Entry Requirements:** An accredited secondary or high school certificate or diploma.
- **Completion Requirement:** 48 academic courses, including a thesis, and 216 hours of community service within 9 years.

 Course credits in the certificate and associate degree programs can be later used towards the associate and bachelor's degrees.

Business Administration



This discipline provides students with comprehensive knowledge of the basic functional areas of business. However, it is usually taught from a secular perspective. As a result, students remain unaware of the legacy of Islamic principles and ethics existing in the fields of accounting, management, and leadership. The Prophet (pbuh) said, "Every one of you is a shepherd, and is responsible for his flock. The leader of people is a guardian and is responsible for his subjects ..." (Sahih Bukhari). Blending Islamic principles with business management will produce a new generation of ethical leaders with uncompromising beliefs and ideals.

Certificate in Business Administration (CBA)

- **Completion Requirement:** 24 academic courses and 72 hours of community service within 6 years.

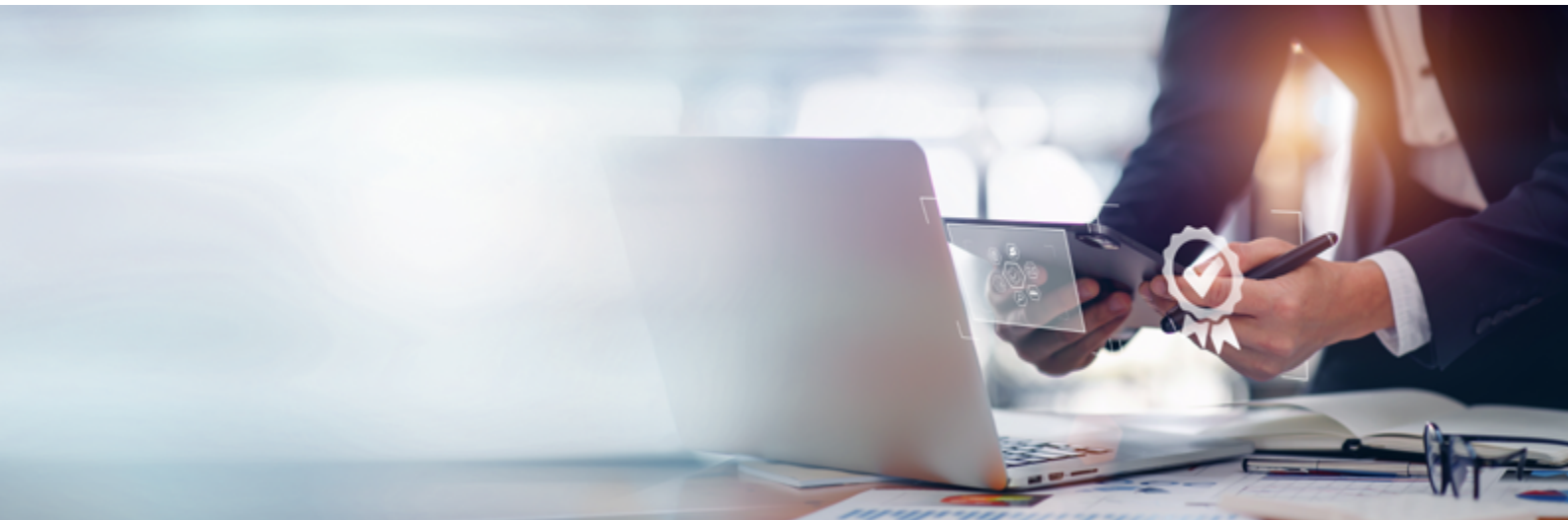
Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA)

This four-year program offers an innovative and comprehensive business administration curriculum, equipping students with essential management skills and knowledge. Students will be taught a range of subjects, including accounting, finance, marketing and management, and become prepared for the global business environment as professionals and ethical managers.

- **Entry Requirements:** An accredited secondary or high school certificate or diploma.
- **Completion Requirement:** 38 academic courses, including a thesis, and 216 hours of community service within 9 years.

 Course credits in the certificate and associate degree programs can be later used towards the associate and bachelor's degrees.

Application Process



IOU has two semesters per year for its degree-level programs, which are the Spring and Fall semesters. Each semester lasts for nearly six months, and both have 5 months of early registration and 1 month of regular registration during the first month of the semester. The Spring semester starts in March and the Fall semester in September, while their exams are held in August and February respectively. For more detailed dates of the various registration and commencement times for the year, see the table below.

Registration

The first step in the student's application process is to complete the electronic application forms for the creation of their degree campus account. These forms collect a student's personal and contact details, along with the selection of the program which they are interested in studying. Students should provide an email account that is regularly checked and a mobile number they have access to, as these are the primary contact methods that IOU will reach out through.

Becoming an IOU student is as easy as:

3. Confirming registration through email
4. Filling in your profile details
5. Paying the US\$10 application fee, either by bank card or wire transfer



Admission

In order to gain admission into IOU, a student must send in necessary documents to the registrar's office for review. Unattested copies of educational documents are accepted during the online application process to expedite the acceptance procedure. These documents must be notarized and resubmitted before a student enters their final semester of study.

The documents required include:


- Passport-size color photo
- A photo ID (passport, driver's license, national ID, etc.)
- Undergraduate Degree: High school certificate or higher
- Postgraduate Certificate: Bachelor's degree
- Master's Degree: Bachelor's degree and if required, also a Postgraduate Certificate
- PhD Degree: Master's degree

Students who do not possess a high school diploma, or choose not to take exams, can opt to take the Audit Course of any bachelor's or master's degree program. A Certificate of Attendance is issued on successful completion of the program.



Enrollment

Once admission has been approved, students can pay their semester fees, then proceed to enroll in courses for that semester. Once prerequisites are met, students will be able to select between 1 and 9 courses they want to study, in order to manage their course load and significantly increase their chances of success. Students who enroll in courses during the early registration period will be granted full access to the virtual campus, including the course media and texts, while new students will also receive a 10% discount on their first semester fees.

Semester Fees



Studying at IOU is affordable, as affordability is one of the guiding principles of the university. We are an institution that seeks its reward from Allah (swt), and therefore does not charge high tuition fees, irrespective of which country the student lives in. Students pay a flat fee per semester depending on their study plan, their country of residence, and the program level.

Study Plans

IOU offers three study plans to make learning more flexible and convenient, based on a student's dedicated time for their studies. For the best results, it is recommended to allocate 5 to 6 hours per course, per week.

Fees

To make fees globally affordable, a sliding scale fee system has been developed based on the standard of living in each country, where countries are divided into 4 development levels: Low, Medium, High and Very High. Scholarships



The International Open University (IOU) attempts to make its programs affordable in all countries. However, there are those who are financially underprivileged and unable to afford tuition. As a result, IOU offers scholarships around the world. Potential candidates must be able to score suitable marks in two entry level Islamic Studies courses, and prove that they are suitable candidates for financial aid. When applying for a Bachelor's, they will also be required to have a high school diploma or its equivalent, and be articulate in the English language.

General Scholarships

Since 2011, IOU has offered 30 to 40 undergraduate scholarships per semester to over 600 students from 35 countries on all 5 continents. Presently, scholarships are only available for Bachelor's degree programs, and the Intensive Arabic Program (IAP). The scholarship is not limited to new students, but is also available to current paying IOU students who have passed five out of six subjects in their last semester. IOU also offers 3 scholarships per semester for the Master's Degree in Islamic Studies (MAIS) program. In general, it will be given to students who had scholarships in the Bachelor's Degree in Islamic Studies (BAIS) or Bachelor's Degree in Arabic Language and obtained a grade A or B.

African Scholarships

In order to improve access to higher education in the African continent and its diaspora, IOU initiated the [1 Million African Scholarship \(1MAS\) project](#), with the support of donors from around the world. The project began in September 2017 in The Gambia and has today expanded to 21 countries and provided over 4 thousand scholarships. It is operating in Cameroon, Eswatini (Swaziland), Ethiopia, Fiji, Gambia, Ghana, Jamaica, Kenya, Liberia, Malawi, Mozambique, Namibia, Nigeria, Rwanda, Sierra Leone, Somalia, South Africa, Tanzania, Uganda, Zambia, and Zimbabwe.

Student Life



Discussion Forums

To facilitate the online interaction between students and faculty members, IOU offers a messaging board system to discuss ideas, questions and concerns related to their studies. Each program has separate forums for announcements, student discussions, teacher questions, and technical feedback. In addition to this, there is a general discussion forum wherein all students of the university can interact with each other.

Community Service

To encourage the participation in voluntary work, students are required to perform 36 hours of community service per semester in order to be awarded their degrees. IOU's aim for its students is to not only acquire knowledge, but also to put their knowledge into action. Community service gives students the opportunity to analyze society critically, learn and reflect through meaningful tasks, and apply their knowledge in a way that benefits their local community and the *Ummah* (nation) at large.

Student Committees

Student committees were first established in 2012 as a medium through which students could collaborate on various activities, as well as provide assistance to other enrolled students and assist with the promotion of IOU within their country or region. The goal is to eventually establish a student committee in every country where students reside. Student committee members consist of existing students, alumni and volunteers. One of the promotional events in which committees participate is the biannual [IOU Awareness Month](#).

Exam Centers

The credibility of the examination process is an important component of online education and that is why semester midterm and final exams are conducted at IOU-approved exam centers. These exam centers are established in mosques, education institutions, or Islamic centers, with authorized proctors responsible for verifying students' photo identification prior to the exam. With over 2,500 exam centers in over 200 countries and territories, students can conveniently go to a center nearest to them or suggest the opening of a new center.

CONTINUING EDUCATION



Established as a subsidiary of IOU in 2013, the Global Quran Memorization Center (GQMC) was mandated with the mission of developing the spiritual growth of its students through the words of Allah (swt). Students are placed in segregated classes according to their gender to protect sisters' modesty. GQMC has 22 qualified teachers and over 2,800 enrolled students.



Memorization Programs

Quran memorization is an integral part of Islamic tradition. As the Prophet (pbuh) said, "The best amongst you are those who learn the Quran and teach it" (Bukhari). GQMC has over 100 graduates from its memorization programs, 8 of whom have become teachers at the center.

Ayah a Day

This program is for those who want to memorize at a slow pace, where they will have three 30-minute or six 15-minute weekly individual one-on-one live sessions. A certificate is given for the completion of a *juz* (part).

One-on-One

This program is focused on students who wish to memorize the Quran through individual one-on-one live sessions twice or thrice per week for a total of 90 minutes. A certificate is given for the completion of a *juz*.

Groups

In order to cater to Muslims around the world, various groups are created for different time zones. Students can choose between the beginner level, where they memorize one or two pages per week, and the advanced level, where they will complete the Quran within four to five years. A certificate is given for the completion of the Quran.

Ijaazah

This one-on-one memorization program is meant for students who want to master *Tajweed* and become expert Quran teachers. Students who complete the program will receive an *Ijaazah* (license authorizing) in memorization from someone who already possesses one, which has a *Sanad* (chain) linked back to the Prophet (pbuh).



Tajweed Programs

Tajweed, which means to perfect or beautify, is a set of rules for the correct pronunciation of the Quran. As the Quran is Allah's Divine Speech, its correct recitation, similar to how it was recited by the Prophet (pbuh) is important to be preserved. Allah (swt) has said, "... this is an honored Quran [Inscribed] in a Preserved Slate" (Surat Al-Buruj (85):21-22).

Starter

This basic 16-week program was designed for beginners with little or no prior knowledge of Tajweed rules. Live classes are held in small groups of 6 to 8 students twice per week, as well as 20 modules of recorded lessons.

Intensive

This advanced six-month program is for students who want to improve on their existing, basic knowledge of Tajweed. It has 22 modules of video material, study tips and live group sessions to be covered in 5 and a half months and then 2 weeks of live practice classes.

Diploma



Following its relaunch in 2007, IOU offered a variety of free short Islamic courses without any educational requirements. In 2010, they were incorporated into IOU's Diploma section in lieu with the launch of the university's degree programs. Currently, this section maintains an open policy, but now requires a nominal monthly fee ranging between US\$1 and \$12, which is determined based on the student's financial capacity. The purpose of the fee is to cover operational costs, and ensure the continued provision of the courses. This IOU subsidiary has produced over 350 graduates and gained over 278,000 registered students from over 252 countries and territories.



New Muslim Courses

This course group was specially designed to cater to new reverts to Islam. Presented by Dr. Bilal Philips, it centers on the fundamental aspects of what should be learned during the initial days of embracing Islam. Divided into two levels, namely '**The First Day**' and '**The First Week**', the courses shed light on crucial points that are often overlooked by those who assisted in the conversion process. '**The First Day**' emphasizes the most significant points that should be known from the start. On the other hand, '**The First Week**' delves into the essential elements of Muslim life, including the importance of the *Salah* (prayer), dietary practices, appropriate attire, and the underlying moral principles that uphold the pillars of Islam and *Eeman* (faith).



General Diploma in Islamic Studies

There are 38 courses within their General Diploma in Islamic Studies (GDIS) program which are divided across 6 levels of advancement. They cover various topics including Arabic, *Fiqh* (Jurisprudence), *Aqeedah* (Theology), *Hadeeth* (Prophetic Narrations), *Tafseer* (Qur'anic Explanation), *Seerah* (Prophetic Biography), Pillars of Islam, Pillars of Faith, Islamic Culture, Contemporary Issues, *Usool* (Foundations) *at-Tafseer*, *Uloom* (Knowledge) al-Qur'an, Qur'anic Arabic, *Usool al-Hadeeth*, Forty Hadith an-Nawawi, Principles of *Da'wah* (Propagation), *Usool us-Sunnah* (Prophetic Traditions), Funeral Rites, and *Qadr* (Divine Decree).

Students can pursue any course that interests them with no prerequisites, and are supported through student forums and email communication with the course facilitator. Courses are divided into modules that have tests at the end of each module. Students take a final exam at the end of each course, and those with a grade of 80% or more are given a course certificate. Students that pass 24 of these courses are eligible for a digital or printed GDIS certificate.

Course facilitators conduct weekly quizzes and winners receive badges which are displayed on student profiles, whereas the runners-up receive e-prizes in their personal inboxes. GDIS graduates are eligible to become course facilitators, so that they can continue their journey with us and transition from student to mentor.



Reflection Upon the Quran

This course group offers the *tafseer* (Quranic explanation) of *Surah al-Faatiha* (The Opening Chapter), *Surah al-Baqara* (Chapter of the Cow), *Surah Ali Imran* (Chapter of the Family of Imran) and *Juz 'Amma* (Chapters 78 to 114). When we reflect on the meaning of the Quran, it encourages us to appreciate its beauty and gain knowledge of the commands of Allah (swt), so that we can become better Muslims.



Special Workshops

The last offering of the diploma section is access to various recorded short workshops that provide participants with more in-depth knowledge of the Islamic faith, including topics like Prophetic advice on marriage, Muslim female empowerment, public speaking, lesson plan Islamization, and young leadership development.

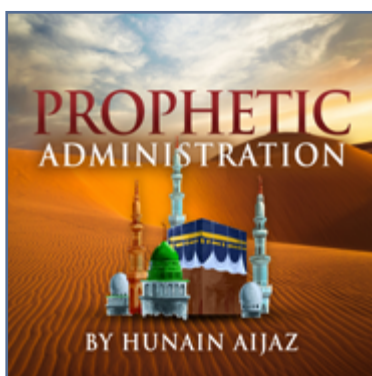
Short Courses
